Announcing Epic Gardens Community Supported Agriculture CSA for 2012

The days are lengthening noticeably. The winter's snow and cold has kept us indoors with catalogs and garden plans. We're excited about 2012 because we are entering our third year of Community Supported Agriculture at Epic Gardens! Our shareholders were pleased so we feel we can expand this year. Purchase a working share or a regular share and choose to include eggs or not.

What You Need To Know

Cost: The basic vegetable share is **\$500.00 for 20 weeks.**

A few working shares are available, so if you'd like to commit to working 3 hours per month during any three months between April and September, either on the farm or at market, knock off \$63.

CSA WORK can consist of weeding, cultivating, harvesting and bagging the produce and other garden chores. You will need to schedule your working time with Epic Gardens and they need to be able to count on you to be there. Working gives you the chance to connect with your farmer and the food you eat. You help the farmers with some of the more labor-intensive chores, and that keeps your share price lower.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

Along with regular fare (like heirloom Tomatoes, Leafy Greens, Squashes, Beans, Peas and Sweet Corn) Epic Gardens is known for somewhat quirky items like Tomatillos and Cilantro, armloads of an extra aromatic variety of Sweet Basil, Baby Ginger, Molukhia (Jute, a green leafy staple of middle eastern cuisine), Bitter Melon, gourmet sweet melons, Jimmy Nardello and Black Pearl Peppers, Edible Bouquets, Sweet Potatoes, and, of course, Edamame, the green vegetable soybean. *Epic Gardens is part of a producer cooperative and your share may include items grown by other local, conscientious gardeners and farmers within an hour or so of Richmond, Virginia.*

Every week or so, an interesting and informative newsletter will appear with recipes and suggestions for using the unusual and new ideas for the usual vegetables.

EGG SHARES are available for \$60 for 12 dozen to CSA Shareholders, but you'll need to reserve them the weeks you want them, because of the great demand.
